PROVINCIAL FESTIVAL ELIGIBILITY

Performers of Junior age and above, with **2 or more** suitable pieces of repertoire are eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival by Local Festival adjudicators.

NATIONAL FESTIVAL ELIGIBILITY

Eligible piano performers may be recommended to **National Music Festival Piano Classes** by the adjudicator(s) at the Provincial finals.

Piano performers wishing to be eligible for National Festival recommendation must:

- Follow all guidelines for Classes 200 in the <u>National Festival Syllabus</u> to ensure that their local festival entry fulfils requirements.
- Ensure that the box at the beginning of the entry form to indicate that they wish to be considered for Nationals. IF THAT BOX IS NOT CHECKED YOUR NAME WILL NOT APPEAR ON THE LIST FOR CONSIDERATION.

Only Junior age and above, with **2 or more** pieces of repertoire of the appropriate level (see details below, and "Provincial Regulations" page) are eligible for recommendation to the Provincial Festival.

There are 4 main categories of Piano Solo Classes that can be entered. Performers may enter one category exclusively, or combine classes from different categories.

- 1. The *Graded Conservatory* category enables students to perform standard repertoire listed and graded in Conservatory syllabi, without regard to the student's age. Performers may enter Graded Classes exclusively or in combination with classes in other categories.
- 2. The *Method Book* category enables students who are not following a Conservatory curriculum (Royal Conservatory or Conservatory Canada) to perform and compete in their local Festival. Students may enter Method Book classes exclusively or in combination with Classes in other categories.
- 3. The *Popular Music* category enables students to perform non-Classical repertoire. Performers may enter 'Popular Music' classes exclusively or in combination with classes in other categories.
- 4. The *Masterwork* category (Classes 2400-2723) enables students to perform standard repertoire not listed in

Conservatory syllabi. For Masterwork classes, expected levels of study for each age category are as follows:
